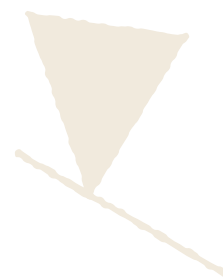
THE FOUNDATION'S YEAR

The year started with great excitement as we welcomed 10 new scholars in August 2022 — a new record of which we were immensely proud. This achievement came with the added pressure to raise funds to reach our target of 50 scholars by the school's centenary in 2026. We are fortunate in this regard to be supported by the school's Endowment Fund and its commitment to match funding every donation, which doubles our fundraising ability.

One of our main focuses this year was to restructure the fundraising department. In this regard, we were thrilled to appoint an Old Paulean, Stephanie Sippli, who joined

us at the end of the first term. Stephanie has been a fantastic addition to the Foundation team and is not only committed to our mission but is also intimately familiar with our community. We have worked hard to develop a new fundraising strategy, which is already yielding results. The return of the Foundation's fundraising events also took place this year, with the "Coronation Cocktail Party" in mid-May as one of the highlights.

To conclude the academic year, after spending time with 20 brilliant and dedicated candidates in our Preparation Course 2022-2023, we selected 11 new scholars. We were also very

We have supported the individual needs of all our scholars and have continued to enhance our programme and promote real inclusion and diversity within the St. Paul's community.

With expected growth in the coming years, undoubtedly new challenges will arise. However, the joy and energy of each of our young

scholars gives us the incentive to keep forging ahead. Bring on next year!

Since then, we have impacted the lives of approximately 700 families and have awarded over 30 full scholarships. Today, we have former scholars in the United States and Europe.

The Foundation enriches the lives of the scholars, and in turn, they enrich the entire school community with their unique perspectives and achievements.

Our goal is **to provide access to an excellent international education for talented young individuals living in São Paulo, through the grant of fully funded scholarships.**

We aspire to support them not only academically but holistically, ensuring they are well prepared to enter top universities in Brazil or abroad. In numerical terms, the school aims to have 50 scholars in the Senior School by its centenary in 2026. This is equivalent to 10% of the Senior School.

As we reflect on the Foundation's Scholarship Programme so far, it is heartening to witness its achievements. We have learnt and evolved, increasing the number of young people we are positively impacting.

From January to March 2022, 183 candidates between the ages of 10 and 14, from 20 different cities in the state of São Paulo, decided to explore the new path of international and holistic education offered by St. Paul's School by applying to our programme. They submitted school reports and prepared two pieces in English: a video introducing themselves

and sharing their motivations for joining the programme and an essay on one of the topics proposed by the Foundation.

After the initial screening process, approximately 80 students were invited to take cognitive and English literacy tests — this was the candidates' first visit to St. Paul's. Of these 80 students, 26 progressed for interviews with the school leadership team. Finally, 20 candidates were selected to join the most awaited phase of the Selection Process: The Preparation Course, also known as the Prep Course.

PREPARATION COURSE: **IMPACT BEYOND SELECTION**

Over the course of one year, participants undergo an immersive and transformative experience in which St. Paul's becomes part of their routine while they are still attending other schools. The Preparation Course allows the school to get to know the candidates, and, more importantly, the candidates get to know the school.

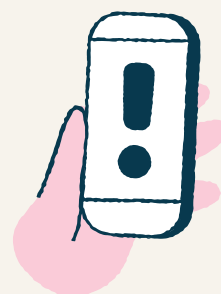
In the first half of the academic year (August to December), students attended regular meetings at St. Paul's, as well as free English classes at Cultura Inglesa, a partner of the St. Paul's Foundation. The second term (February to May 2023) pupils had further immersion in English language, British culture and education. Students came to school three times a week and participated in classes in various subjects, mostly conducted in English with over 30 volunteer teachers at the school.

In addition to academic content and an introduction to the school's teaching, candidates had meetings with the Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) team at St. Paul's, as well as got to know current scholars and other Pauleans.

The Preparation Course offers an intense experience and a unique opportunity for students to learn a new language and develop a range of new skills, which they will benefit from throughout their lives. During the 12 months of the course, scholarship candidates also receive visits from a social worker to better understand their family and home environment. A psychologist interviews students and their parents to learn more about the candidate's psychological profile.

- ✓ Opportunity for a free course at one of the country's best language schools
- ✓ Acquisition of new perspectives and additional knowledge in school subjects
- ✓ Access to a new curriculum
- ✓ Interaction with teachers and students from diverse backgrounds
- ✓ Development of interpersonal skills

TESTIMONY:

JONAS VIANA, CANDIDATE IN THE 2019-2020 SELECTION PROCESS

"We learned more about St. Paul's educational system and how it is different to a Brazilian education. It wasn't just about learning a different culture, you could also use the academic knowledge you gained to, for example, secure a scholarship or other opportunities elsewhere.

I remember the interaction with my peers in the Preparation Course. It was very interesting because there were various age groups and diverse backgrounds. We talked a lot, and there was a sense of team unity, participating together in the Selection Process and not seeing each other as competitors. It was a really friendly environment.



I learned a lot about soft skills, like my ability to communicate with people. I find this very interesting because, in college, for example, as we do projects and group work, there needs to be effective communication among team members because when you get to work in your professional field it's all about you and a team, right? I liked that the Preparation Course encourages you to have an open mind. You step out of your everyday bubble and realise there is a totally different way of thinking."

SELECTION PROCESS 2024

from January 2023 to June 2024

The beginning of the year marks two simultaneous processes: the transition of the 2022-2023 Selection Process to the final phase and the opening of a new opportunity for children and teenagers to apply for the Scholarship Programme, this time competing for spots in August 2024.

We increased the number of organisations and *Diretorias de Ensino* with whom we worked to promote our Selection Process. This resulted in a record 185 applicants from the city of São Paulo and 17 different cities in the state. The candidates came from a number of state and private schools, with some coming from projects and institutions that support children and teenagers in different areas.

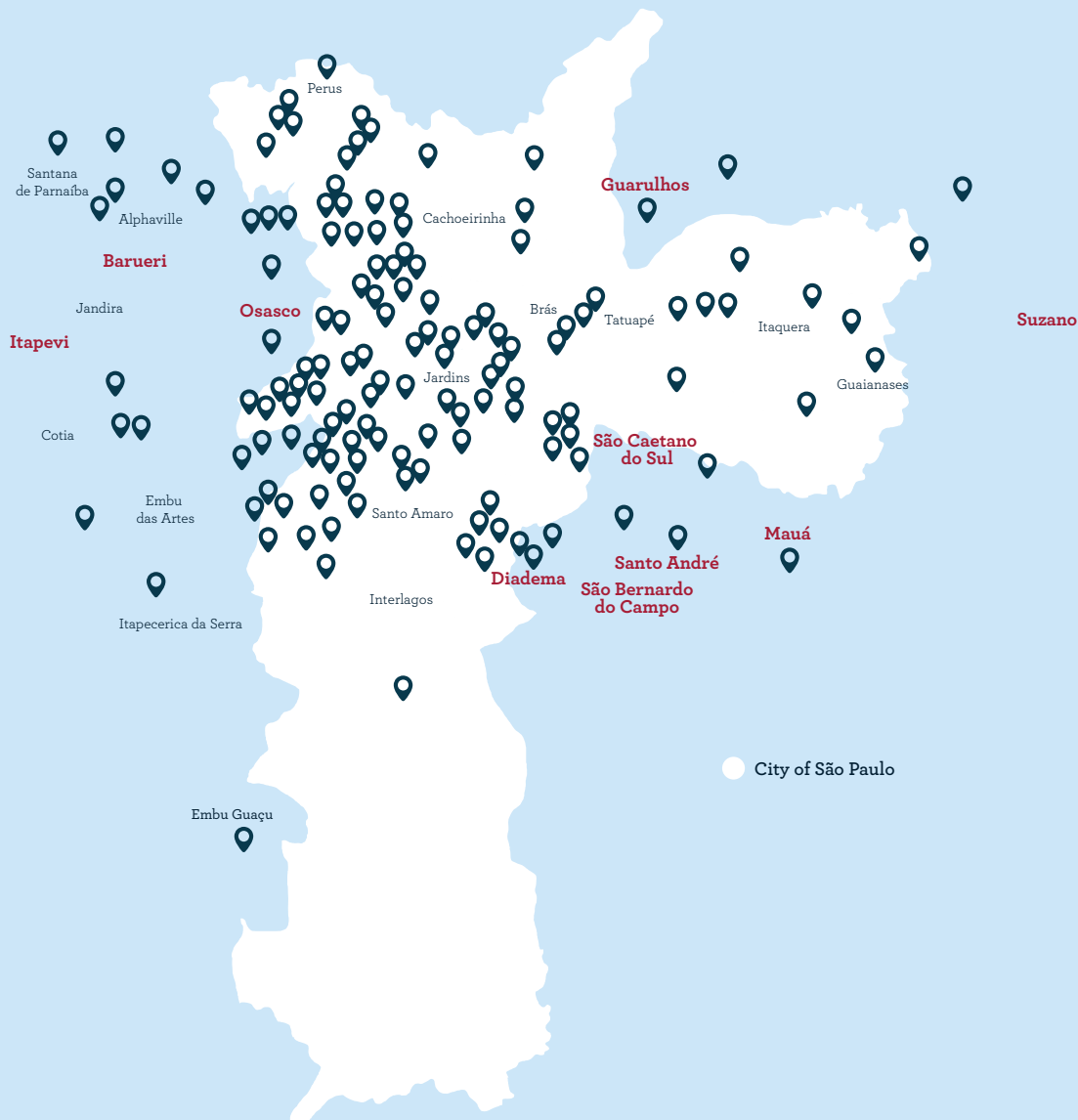

After reviewing all the materials submitted by the applicants, we selected 90 candidates to sit aptitude tests at the school in April. Of these, 36 were selected for interview, and a record 32 students take part in the 2023-2024 Preparation Course.

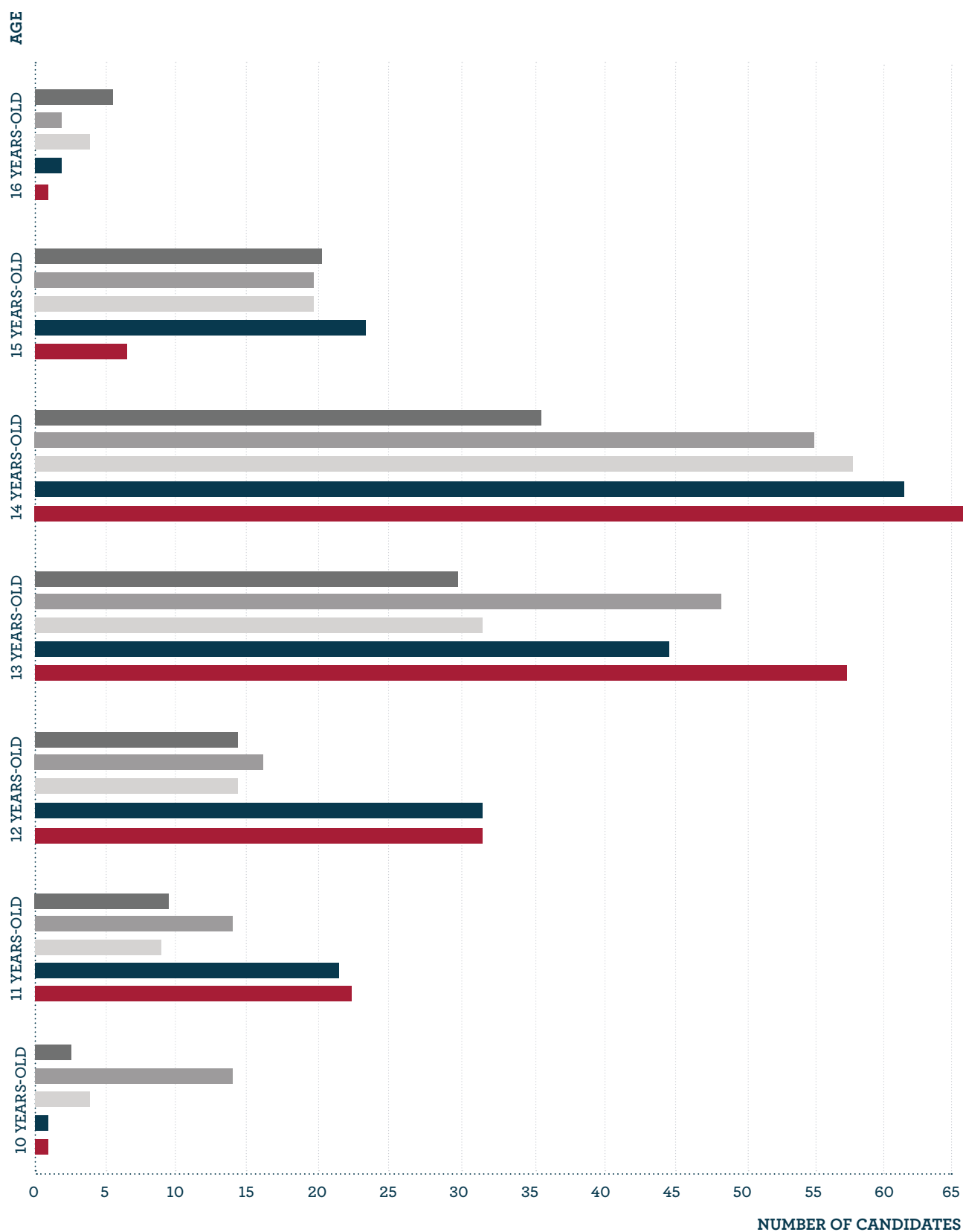
Throughout the year-long course, students have an immersive experience both inside and

outside the school. They have a term of free English classes at Cultura Inglesa as well as weekly classes at St. Paul's. Students perfect their English and learn about British culture and education, while also developing their interpersonal skills. Those who excel will be offered a scholarship to join St. Paul's in August 2024.

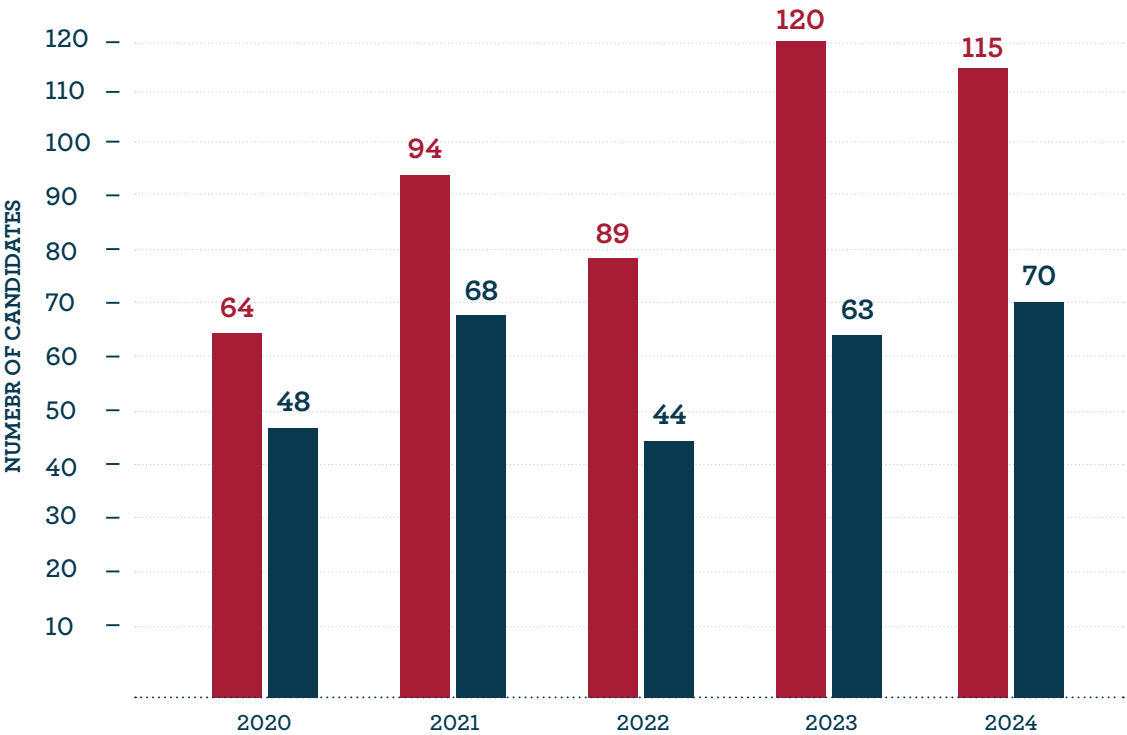

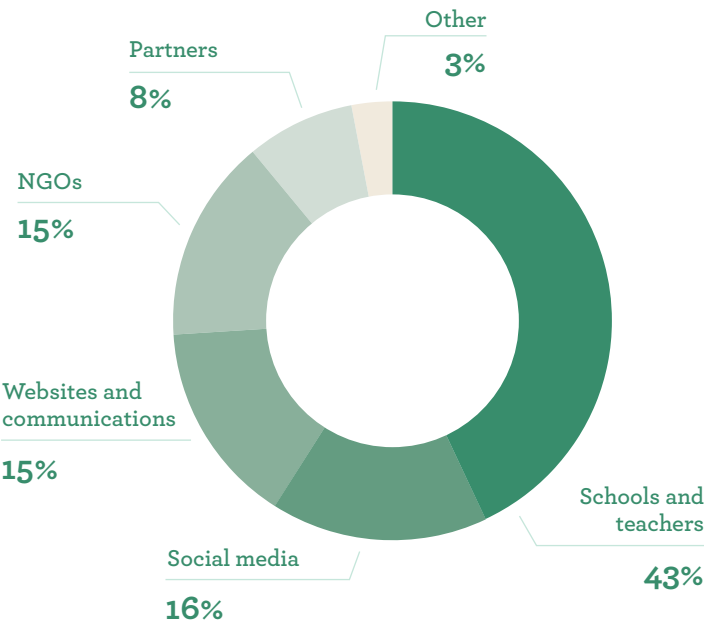

ANALÚ RIBEIRO

15 YEARS-OLD, FORM 4



It's powerful to know that you're representing people who can't be in your position, that you're doing your best to say, 'we also exist, we are also here.' This is very strong



Analú lives in Taboão da Serra, in Greater São Paulo, and has been seeking new opportunities in education from an early age. At 11, she enrolled in Cidadão Pró-Mundo (CPM), which offers free English courses to state school students and is a partner of the Foundation. Analú first applied for a scholarship at St Paul's in 2019, and although she didn't succeed at first, she continued to focus on her studies and personal growth. She re-applied and was awarded a scholarship in 2022. She is now in her second year at school and was elected House Captain for Windsor. Since arriving at St Paul's Analú has flourished and inspires those around her.

I had some insecurity about my hair being different, and coming from a different social class, and even because of the color of my skin. But, as soon as I entered the school, people were very friendly, and I also made myself available to exchange ideas. Students were curious but also welcoming of the new entrants. With the other Foundation scholars, I have the same feeling of openness, of being together. We are a close-knit group.

I was part of the basketball and volleyball teams, played tennis, and joined the crochet club. I also helped with the set design of the school play. Not every place gives you the

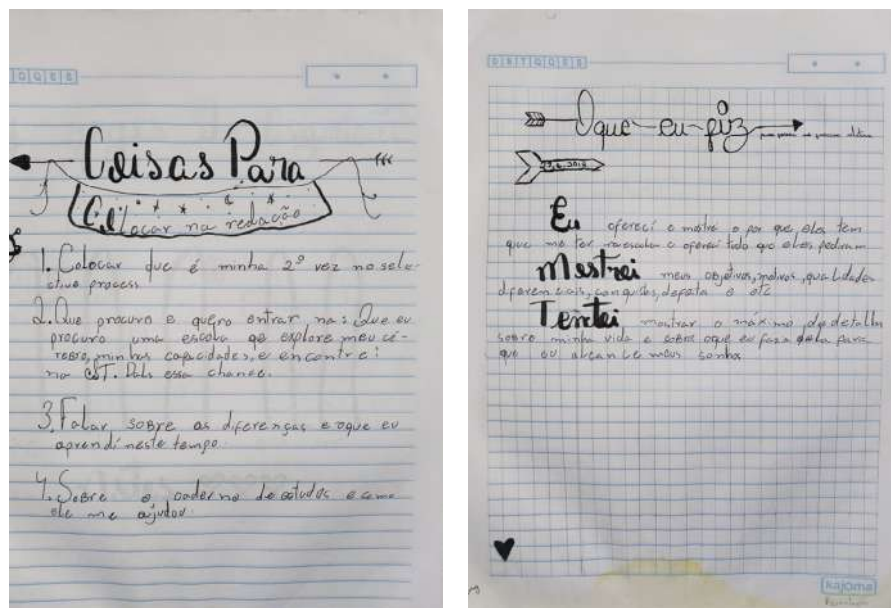
chance to have an activity in your schedule dedicated to a hobby you love. All of this has helped me meet more people and in a deeper way, which is great and makes the experience much more complete.

When my mother and I learned about the Selection Process through CPM, we doubted it was a real opportunity because, coming from the social background I come from, this really seems like a dream! When I first applied, I was an 11-year-old child. I took a notebook from my school and wrote down everything, absolutely everything about the school. I researched St. Paul's inside out and knew then that it would suit me. I talked to my mother, started studying, and took several tests, including cognitive assessments I found on the internet.

I saw the Scholarship Programme as the opportunity of a lifetime.

I remember that my school was closed due to the pandemic, and during this period without classes I woke up every day at 6 a.m. to study for the Selection Process. I wrote everything in my notebook, and I still have it with me today!

When I arrived at St. Paul's for the start of the Preparation Course, I was struck by how different everything was! The library had so

many books — I love books! The court, the field, the classrooms, the quality of education... My school had 45 students in a classroom, and they couldn't support all these students.

When the news came that I had been awarded the scholarship, I cried a lot; it was a dream come true. It was a process of more than three years for me, and I thought about my personal growth. This was something I wanted since I was 11 years old and had fought hard for.

When I told my mother about it she called everyone, and we had the biggest party at home. The whole family is transformed with this opportunity. I am a role model for my younger cousins, who want to apply in the future. As a young, black person from the suburbs, we carry many people with us. I have several friends from my old school, more than 20 young people, who, due to their age, cannot apply for the Selection Process, but because of me, they started learning English. It's powerful to know that you're representing

people who can't be in your position, that you're doing your best to say, 'we also exist, we are also here.' This is very strong.

The last day of my first year here was very memorable; I left telling everyone that I was a true Paulean. I felt the impact of having lived a year with these people, in the same place, speaking the same language, dealing with the same problems, and I cried saying goodbye to friends I made. I saw that I really was part of this, that I was no longer a new student: now I am part of the community, and I am here to help the new pupils at St. Paul's.

I think about joining the Student Council and becoming a Prefect. I also want to be part of a social impact project here at school because it's really good to be with your friends working for a cause, and helping vulnerable people in society. And as a career, I think about pursuing Engineering, but I am open to other possibilities.

LETÍCIA REIS

16 YEARS-OLD, FORM 5



My experience in the Selection Process and as a scholar has helped me to better communicate with people, working in a team, thinking quickly and critically



Letícia first applied to the Scholarship Programme in 2019. She learned about the opportunity through an NGO she was a part of, Ismart, while attending middle school at a state school. Letícia is in her second year at the school and participates in various extra-curricular activities. For her, the courage to change, the spirit of collaboration, and kindness are a significant part of this experience.

When Ismart introduced me to the Selection Process, it seemed like an opportunity out of my reach. I thought, 'wow, what world is this that I didn't even know existed?' During the Selection Process, we met many people who helped us develop skills, and gain confidence.

My first year at St. Paul's was an emotional rollercoaster because everything was new. Then you explore the opportunities the school gives you such as clubs, sports, and learning resources, and you adapt to all of it. I was able to experience a bit of everything this year, and I couldn't have settled in better.

In school, I met people from various backgrounds and had a connection with the teachers unlike anything I had in other schools. And you also have a lot of access to various activities, so you can try things you always wanted to try but didn't have the opportunity to. For example, I always wanted to learn the

violin, and I've been taking lessons since the beginning of Form 4. I'm also taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award which has been amazing as I had never camped before. I loved it! It was much more challenging than I expected, however, it taught me a lot about perseverance because you have low moments, but you also have high moments, and you have to enjoy everything while you can. I also joined the One Goal project, which has allowed me to see what it really means to help other people. It's a unique feeling. One of the biggest values

I notice in the school is to 'be kind.' Everyone is kind, students take responsibility, teachers are respectful, everyone always tries to help each other. This has really impacted me and my family.

My experience in the Selection Process and as a scholar has helped me communicate better, work well in a team as well as think quickly

and critically. It's much easier for me to solve problems, both inside and outside of school. From the beginning until now, it's been two years or more, and I guess I was a completely different person than I am now. That makes me very grateful and also proud of myself because it shows that I'm not standing still, you know?

VICTOR MEDEIROS

13 YEARS-OLD, FORM 3



An experience like this changed and still changes every aspect of my life



Victor highlights his academic and personal growth since becoming a scholar. In addition to his dedication to studies, he sees various opportunities for growth outside the classroom, through debate and public speaking clubs and exchanges with other students. Today, he is a House Captain and wishes to use this role to be a positive role model for his Tudor housemates.

I see myself very differently, for the better, since I applied for the Selection Process and even after my first year at school. I developed study and communication skills and have improved in English and other subjects. An experience like this changed and still changes every aspect of my life. At first, it took me a little while to adapt, but that's normal. Later, I liked the way the school teaches subjects and the availability of books and resources for us to learn on our own. The interaction between me and my classmates was very

smooth; everyone was very welcoming. In no time, I was interacting with classmates as if they were friends I had known for a long time.

In enrichment, I was able to learn a lot of things that I certainly wouldn't have learned in another school. I had never done debating, and I really like politics, so last year, I participated in the Debate Club and the *Mini Congresso*, which I loved. The McCann Society was also something very different because it's another opportunity for you, as a student, to share what you know with other students around you.

I had my first rowing experience when I joined the Rowing Club, which I am still involved in. I am continually learning new things, including how to work in a team. Additionally, I am gaining skills in physical preparation and organisation. I participated in house competitions and am now a house captain. I feel

proud of my development because I believe I have worked hard. I try to be a better version of myself every day and I hope that my house wins again this year. 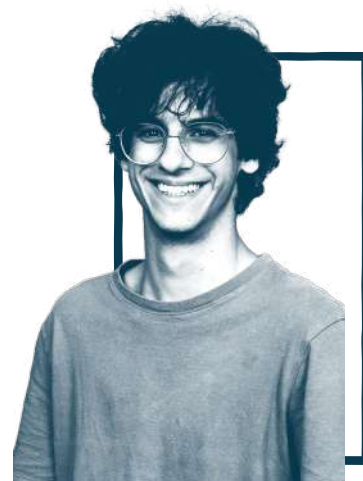

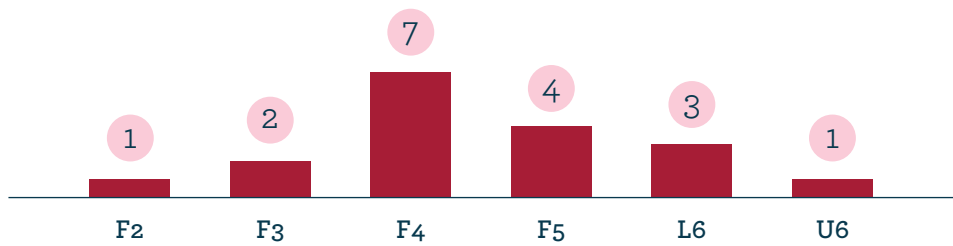

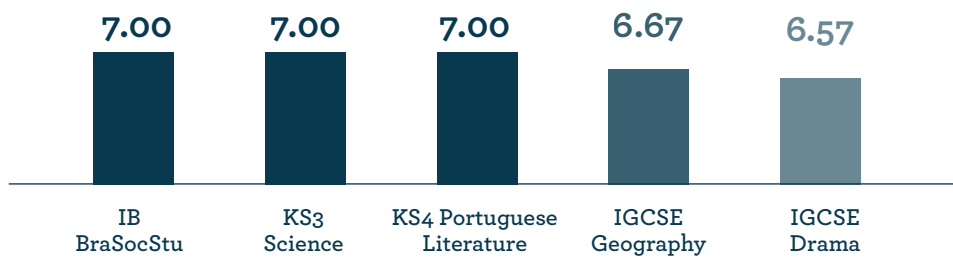
DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOLARS BY YEAR



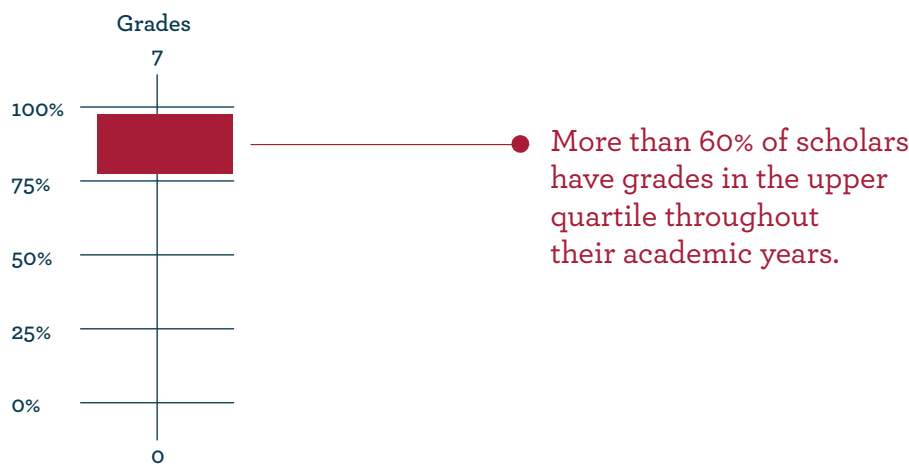
AVERAGE SCHOLARS' GRADES

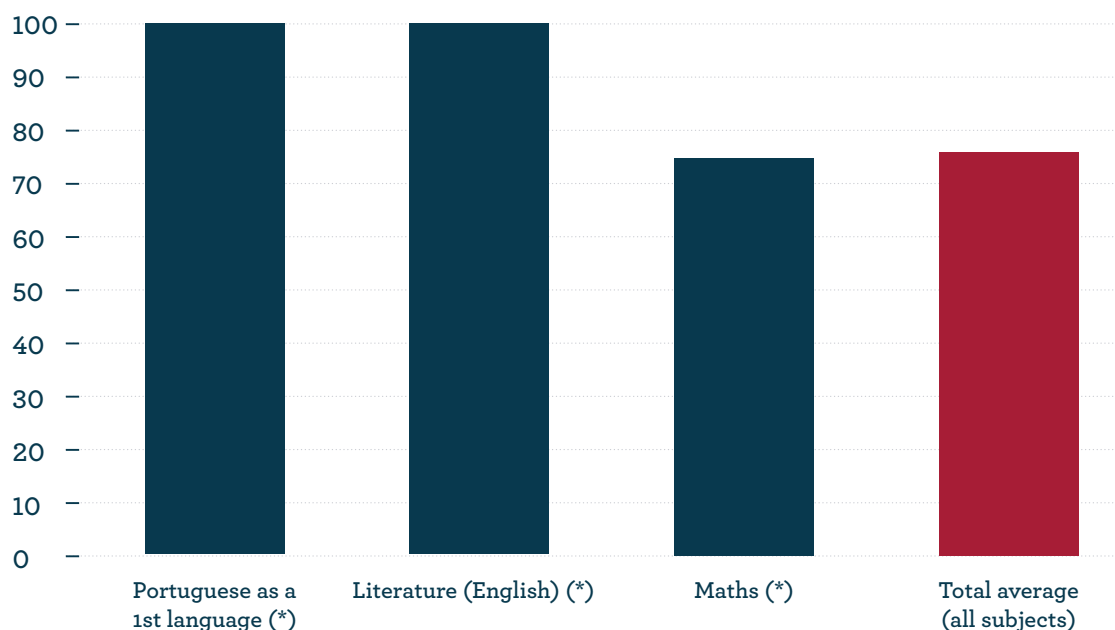

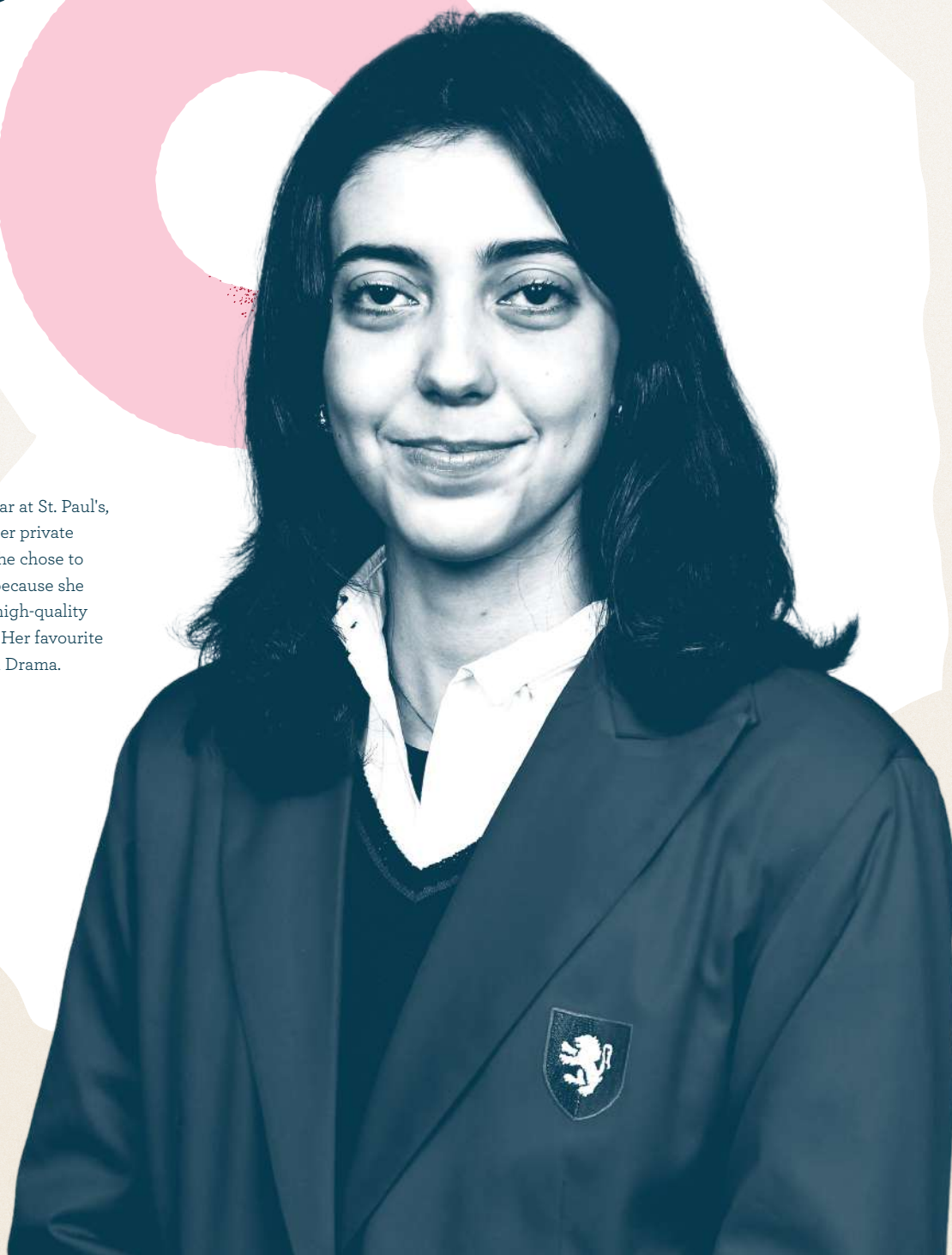

INTEGRATION OF SCHOLARS AND SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Ensuring our scholars and their families settle into the St. Paul's community is crucial. To help achieve this, we host a barbecue at the beginning of the academic year to introduce new scholars and their families to existing ones. This helps create a support network and allows families to share their experiences.

To assist scholars settle into the school, we work with the PTA to run a Buddy Family system. Each scholar and their family are paired with a St. Paul's pupil's family from the same year group. The goal is to help scholars and their families to settle into the school community, address specific needs, provide translations, introduce them to the school traditions, events, and everything that St. Paul's special.

Recognizing that language might be a barrier for the parents of our scholars, the buddy families offer assistance. They are also eager to learn, and we have volunteers offering English classes for interested parents.

Focusing specifically on scholars, well-being sessions are conducted with the Social Emotional Learning team. These monthly group sessions encourage all scholars to share their academic and social experiences. It's a safe space where extra support needs can be identified.

International Day: Collective Community Spirit

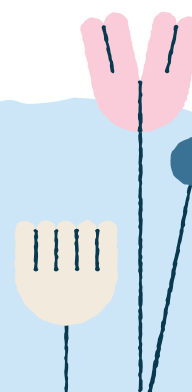

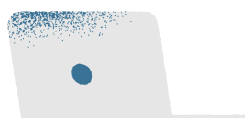

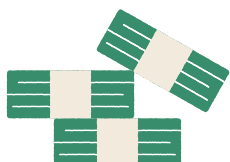

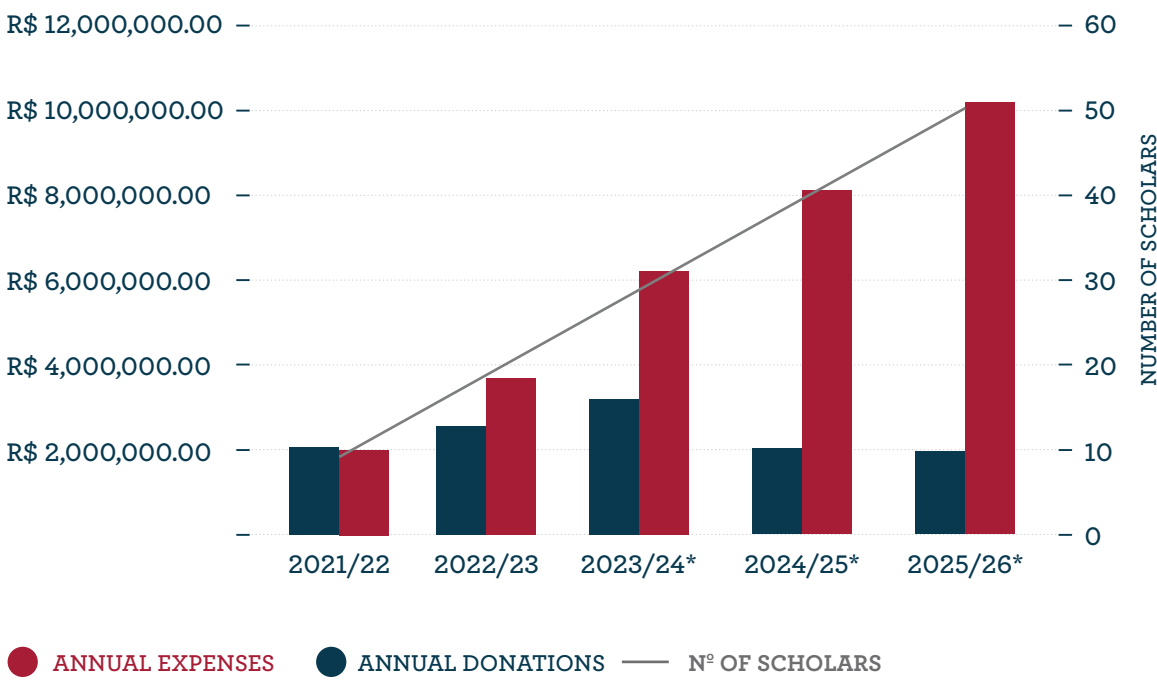
A VISION FOR THE FUTURE

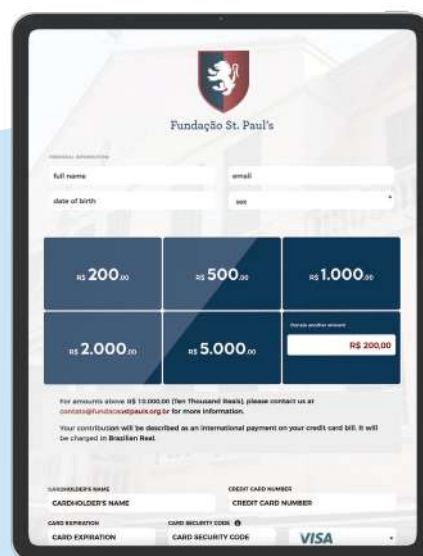
